Hope everyone has a wonderful summer.



# Tour I: Our Military Heritage Tour







This itinerary includes the Soldiers' Memorial Military Museum, box lunch at Jefferson Barracks Historic Park and a guided tour at Jefferson Barracks Museum.

Your first stop is the Soldiers' Memorial Military Museum, dedicated by President Roosevelt in 1936 to the 1,075 St. Louisans who died in action in World War I. The museum contains photographs and memorabilia pertaining to St. Louisans' military involvement since the Civil War. You will also see the colorful mosaic ceiling of the loggia, dedicated to the mothers of St. Louisans who died in wars, as well as four massive Bedford Stone sculptures depicting Courage, Sacrifice, Vision and Loyalty, which guard the entrances of the Memorial.

Enjoy a box lunch en route to Jefferson Barracks Historic Park. Established in 1826 and stretching over 1,702 acres, this military post overlooking the Mississippi River was once the largest in America. Its strategic location helped open the West and protected American interests in the newly-acquired land.

You will enjoy a private, guided tour at the park's museum. Take a walk through the history of the Civil War, Spanish-American War and World Wars I and II. The last stop is the Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery, the 4<sup>th</sup> largest cemetery in the nation. More than 100,000 veterans or their dependents, including Union and Confederate soldiers, are buried here.

## Tour 2: Landmarks of St. Louis Tour







This itinerary includes views of the Old Cathedral, Old Courthouse, Busch Stadium, the Riverfront, a tram ride at the Gateway Arch, and full brewery tour at Anheuser-Busch Brewery.

Your Destination St. Louis tour guide traces the history of St. Louis beginning with the city's original settlement, Laclede's Landing. It is now a nine-block historic district filled with renovated turn-of-the-century buildings housing shops, eateries and offices. Visit the famous Gateway Arch, the Nation's tallest monument commemorating the gateway to the west for thousands of 19th century pioneers. Here, take a tram ride to the top for a unique bird's eye view of the city or watch a documentary on how this magnificent steel structure was created. Just east of the Arch, pass the excursion riverboats that call the Mississippi River home.

Enjoy a view of the Old Cathedral, the oldest west cathedral of the Mississippi. Across the street is the Old Courthouse, the setting for cases involving slavery, the fur trade and equal rights. Of these cases, the Dred Scott Freedom Trial is the most notable. You will pass Busch Stadium and St. Louis Union Station, once the busiest rail terminal in the world. Today, Union Station has undergone a magnificent renovation and is home to a luxury hotel and more than 70 specialty shops and restaurants. You will have time to explore Union Station and enjoy lunch on your own.

Your Destination St. Louis tour guide will familiarize you with the rich history of the colorful Busch family en route to the King of Beers—the Anheuser-Busch Brewery. Situated in a complex with over 70 red brick structures on 100 acres, the brewery buildings are known for their unique architecture and several are National Historic Landmarks. During the tour, you will see the World Famous Clydesdales, the Fermentation Building, the Packaging and Bottling Plant, the Brew House and a film about the brewing process. No visit would be complete without a stop in the hospitality room to sample the family of Anheuser-Busch products.



# Tour 3: Slots & Shops in St. Charles









Visit St. Charles, the oldest town on the Missouri River, with a Destination St. Louis tour guide. Founded as *Les Petites Cotes* (The Little Hills) by French Canadians, St. Charles has carefully preserved its heritage as a river town that has been welcoming visitors since 1769. Thousands of pioneers replenished supplies here on the awesome journey west.

St. Charles is a source of multiple historical encounters: the Lewis and Clark Rendezvous, Missouri's First State Capitol and the origin of the Boone's Lick Trail. Enjoy a driving tour of Main Street; a nine-block historic district filled with 80 restored buildings dating from 1790 to 1900. Today, this cobblestone and gas lit street is known for its gift, antique and craft shops.

You may visit Missouri's First State Capitol or the Lewis & Clark Nature Center on your own. The Capitol has been completely restored and furnished as it appeared during the period of 1821-1826 when the Missouri State Legislature met in St. Charles. The lower level of the Nature Center houses replicas of the three boats of the Lewis & Clark Discovery Expedition. Upstairs, the Nature Center is a "hands-on" museum following the adventures of Lewis and Clark into the wilderness of the West. Enjoy various displays of Native American tribes, the men of the expedition with their equipment and artifacts and a walk through the forest as it was during Lewis and Clark's expedition.

The gamblers in the group may try their luck at the Ameristar Casino, which offers 45,000 square feet of Las Vegas-style gaming on two dockside levels including 3,300 slot machines and 95 gaming tables. Your Destination St. Louis tour guide will provide you with a pick-up location and time for departure back to downtown St. Louis.
