The History of "Anchors Aweigh"

"Anchors Aweigh", the unofficial march song of the U.S. Navy has an interesting history. It was composed

by Lt. Charles A. Zimmerman who was the band master of the US Naval Academy. He composed the music while Alfred Hart Miles composed the original lyrics.

Each year, Lt. Zimmerman would compose a fight song for the annual Navy-Army game (my choice of designation for this game!). Anchors Aweigh was first publicly played

at the annual game on December 1, 1906. By the way, Navy won this game 10-1.

EST

The song was gradually adopted as the song of the U.S. Navy. Although

there is a pending proposal to make it the official song, and to incorporate protocol into Navy regulations for its performance, its status re-

mains unofficial. Its lyrics were considered too specific to the Academy and not representative of the Navy at large, and so were rewritten by George D. Lottman. Its melody was also slightly rewritten by Domenico Savino.

In later years verses were added; however, these have been unused for a long time. More modern lyrics were written

by George D. Lottman in 1926. The version used today was written in 1997 by MCPON John Hagan:

Stand Navy out to sea, fight our bat-




